X. ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR

Members of the audience who wish to distribute written information to the Board must give materials to the Board Secretary prior to the beginning of the meeting.

In order to conduct district business in an orderly and efficient manner, the Board requires that public presentations to the Board comply with the following procedures:

Individual speakers shall be allowed five minutes to address the Board on each agenda or non-agenda item. The Board shall limit the total time for public input on each agenda item to 20 minutes. With Board consent, the president may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard.

The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board on any item of interest to the public that is within the subject matter

jurisdiction of the Board during the Board's consideration of the item. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3)

At the time so designated on the agenda at a regular meeting, members of the public may bring before the Board matters that are not listed on the agenda. The Board shall take no action or discussion on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as authorized by law. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.2)

Whenever a member of the public initiates specific complaints or charges against an employee, the Board president shall inform the complainant that in order to protect the employee's right to adequate notice before a hearing of such complaints and charges, and also to preserve the ability of the Board to legally consider the complaints or charges in any subsequent evaluation of the employee, it is the policy of the Board to hear such complaints or charges in closed session unless otherwise requested by the employee pursuant to Government Code 54957. The Board President shall also encourage the complainant to file a complaint using the appropriate district complaint procedure.

The above are excerpts from **Board Bylaw 9323** – Meeting Conduct.

XI. PUBLIC HEARING

Sufficiency of Instructional Materials for 2015-16

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing to determine that every pupil, including English learners, has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials in the subjects of mathematics, science, history-social science, and reading/language arts that are aligned to the state academic standards and consistent with the content and cycles, including the English language development component of an adopted program, of the curriculum frameworks will be held on Monday, September 14, 2015, in Room 201 at Fallbrook Union High School, 2400 South Stage Coach Lane, Fallbrook, California, 92028, at 6:30 p.m., at which time all interested persons will be heard by the Board of Trustees of the Fallbrook Union High School District. Participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders is encouraged.

The Board of Trustees will further determine as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects.

The Board of Trustees shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12 inclusive.

"Sufficient textbooks or instructional materials," as defined in Education Code 60119, means that each student in the district, including English learners, has a standards-aligned textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class or to

take home. This law does not require two sets of textbooks or instructional materials for each student.

In addition to the definition of "sufficiency" in Education Code 60119, Education Code 1240.3 and 42605, as added and amended by SBX3 4 (Ch. 12, Third Extraordinary Session, Statutes of 2009) and ABX4 2 (Ch. 2, Fourth Extraordinary Session, Statutes of 2009), specify that, for the 2008-09 through the 2013-14 fiscal years, "sufficiency" means that all students in the district who are enrolled in the same course have "identical" standards-aligned textbooks and instructional materials from the same adoption cycle. As amended, Education Code 1240.3 does not require districts to purchase all of the instructional materials included in an adoption if the materials that are purchased are made available to all the students for whom they are intended in all of the schools within the district.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that at the conclusion of the public hearing, the Board of Trustees of the Fallbrook Union High School District will adopt or decline to adopt *Resolution 03-1415*, *Sufficiency of Instructional Materials for 2014-2015*.
